Unfinished Business:

Lunch arbor Mural Progress- We received a quote from Ryan Lyoko for \$2200.

Art Corps:

- The full program is a developmental curriculum of 8 lessons for K-5 and 5 lessons for TK.
- Art Corps provides the on-site training for each lesson as well as advises a leadership team in recruiting and organizing the volunteers, helps with ordering and maintaining the supplies, and guides volunteers in putting on a school wide art show featuring artwork from every student. (This could potentially be another event “Art Show” and or incorporated into an existing Dailard event)
- The volunteer base is essential in bringing the lessons to the students. They recommend that there be at least two volunteers for each classroom.
 - o Hearst has 2 Coordinators and 40-50 parent volunteers
- The cost for Art Corps's is approx. \$8500 for TK-5, and the additional supply cost would be determined by the number of students served.
 - o They can tailor the program to the budget available in a variety of ways, including reducing the number of lessons, or limiting the grade levels taught.
 - o Since they hold training workshops at school during the school day, they need to have a reliable space where about 10-15 volunteers can do the art projects (Robotics room?) and they need to have a space for housing the supplies (STEAM room)?
- Art Corps would fall under Visual & Performing Arts chair to manage – this way their responsibility falls on the DSF to manage and continue the program and no longer have to rely on hiring an art teacher that may or may not last – along with all the back and forth of a hiring process, finding candidates, etc...

Will discuss for budget 2020-2021

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EduDance

- For 4th and/or 5th grade students – Discussing which grades we will offer
 - Students learn 5 different dances over a course of 12 weeks (as well as etiquette training)
 - Class meet with instructor once a week for 45 minutes
 - They do a Showcase at the end of the session – can be during school hours or after
 - o Hearst rents out the auditorium at Lewis and does an evening Showcase for parents
 - Cost: \$120 per class per week or \$1440 per session per class – need to pay by end of April
